Tips For Submitting a Conference Proposal

Here are a four things every proposal should include:

- Background information and a complete description of your topic
- Relevant theories and research
- An outline of the presentation, including description of format
- Intended learning outcomes for participants

Don't forget to create a stand-out Abstract!

The abstract is a brief description of your presentation that provides the reader with an accurate picture of what the presentation will cover. The Abstract helps conference attendees choose between different sessions. Well-written abstracts identify the purpose and intent of the program, are concise, organized and specific.
