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Florida High School Graduates Finish Strong in Advance Placement Exam Completion

The AP National Participation and Performance results have been released for the high school graduating class of 2015.

Email attachments are quickly being replaced by Google Docs. With email attachments, copies of an original document can be generated multiple times. Edits to these documents can easily be overlooked or lost. Email attachments can be hard to keep track of and can be referred to as the slow mode of communication.

In the tech-savvy world we live in today, consumers expect quick responses. Google Docs is the answer to the "quick" method of communication. All it takes is a Google account. Once you have an account, you can share your document with people using a private link sent to their email. The document can then be viewed by everyone at once with real-time edits made to the document updating it automatically. Google Docs can also be used for spreadsheets and presentations.

As of February 24, 2016, **Florida Keys Community College** has its first bachelor's degree program: Bachelor of Applied Science in Supervision and Management (BAS-SM). The Florida State Board of Education unanimously approved FKCC's proposal for the new program. Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) approval is anticipated in June. The college will change its name to the "College of the Florida Keys" to reflect inclusion of higher level degree programs.

named a New York City Commissioner by Bill de Blasio, the Mayor of New York City. Bishop will oversee Small Business Services. Aside
